Project Description:

This proposal provides the resources necessary to execute the goal of renergenzing the Get Ready Program and ulitmatly bringing the 250,000 people in Marin County to a higher level of disaster preparedness. This is the second year of a two year plan to increase disaster preparedness.

This will be accomplished by using the existing "Get Ready Progam" and reinvigorating the awareness and energy needed to prepare the residents and visitors of Marin for the inevitable disaster.

The Marin County Disaster Council identified disaster preparedness as one of the highest priorities facing the County and the "Get Ready Progam" as the "shovel ready project" to implement resiliency Countywide.

The proprosal will bring training into all of the Schools countywide as well as the homes of over 40,000 school children. This will be delivered through "Get Ready 5^{th} Grade" as well as handouts/homework for younger school children.

The awareness campaign will deliver information to the doorsteps of every resident Countywide. Additionally, both print and digital media will be used to direct residents to a robust and intuitive existing web-site where families can develop emergency plans and ultimately prepare them and their homes for disaster.

Local Fire Agencies will host a minimum of 24 "Get Ready" courses during this grant period, allowing residents that want instructor based training the benefit of "in person" eduction/awareness.

For Training Projects:

- Each 5th Grade Class will receive instructor based training using the "Get Ready 5th Grade Program and materials" Once this grant is approved and funding received the training will commence and be completed within 1 year. This will include over 3000 5th grade students.
- 24 Get Ready Program training courses will be offered within the first year of grant allowing for 2400 residents to have hands on training.
- The web-site which the marketing campaign will direct traffic towards provides the opportunity to train all 250,000 residents and 110,000 homes in Marin County.

Project Need

As we are painfully aware, Marin County is threatened by a variety of disasters, including but not limited to: terrorism, wildland fires, earthquakes and floods. The majority of our daily population (residents and transient) are ill prepared to mitigate the threat posed. The Get Ready Program inaugurated 15 years ago to teach residents to shelter in place and avoid becoming victims in a disaster, can provide improved preparedness both for individuals and communities. Over the intervening 15 years the population of Marin has changed dramatically and the original Get Ready Program must be reinvigorated!

Over the last 24 months the Marin County Disaster Council (DC3) created a sub-group to identify some of the largest gaps for emergency preparedness in the County and develop a plan to help mitigate these issues. The number one goal of this multi-agency represented group was to reinvegorate the "Get Ready Progam".

Homeland Security starts with a population that is resilient, allowing government and emergency personnel to focus on the most critical tasks at hand during a disaster.
