



## Marin's Wildfire Risks: Let's Change the Odds

Look for these signs in your neighborhood, on bus stops, and roaming around on the backs of buses this summer.

It's a friendly yet urgent reminder for you to review your Wildfire Risk Report online at:

<u>MarinWildfire.org/dspace</u>. You can also request to have the report mailed to you and it is available in Spanish.

Type in your address and you will gain access to a thorough assessment of your home and yard's wildfire risks. It provides a checklist, photos and explanations about how to make your property less susceptible to ignition. This report is your personalized guide to home safety – and it's paid for by your tax dollars. So take advantage of this opportunity and OPEN YOUR REPORT today!



Most houses in Marin have been inspected for wildfire risks and reports are waiting for residents to open online. Teams of inspectors from our local fire departments are moving back out into the community to reassess homes to see what progress has been made and to note issues that still need to be addressed. Some of these fixes are required by law and must be addressed within 30 days of your notice. Once you have done the work, like removing a hazardous plant or clearing under your deck, please go back into your report and check the box to let your fire department know you have done the work. This will help Marin Wildfire monitor risk reduction countywide. Thank you!

## We CAN lower risks of wildfire if we all do our part. Here's how:



1. Your home is evaluated for wildfire risks by your local fire department annually. A detailed report shows you what needs to be done to lower your risks.



2. Review your report online or request a copy be mailed to you. Go to marinwildfire/dspace.org or call (415) 275-1185 for help and resources.



**3. Reduce your risks.** The report includes an action plan, starting with the highest risks. Do the work over time and mark your progress on your report.
